

Information and Consent Form for Under-Eye Dark Circle Treatment Injection

✿ About the Treatment

This treatment uses a next-generation anti-aging injectable (Sunekos) to help improve the appearance of under-eye dark circles.

The procedure involves injecting a combination of low molecular weight, non-crosslinked hyaluronic acid and a blend of six amino acids into the dermis. This is expected to help reduce pigmentation and improve skin texture in the under-eye area.

Dark circles under the eyes

✿ Treatment Method and Process

After cleansing and preparing the skin, the treatment is performed using a fine syringe.

The active ingredients are injected directly into the dermal layer to ensure effective absorption and results.

✿ Precautions and Possible Side Effects

Allergies:

Sunekos injections mainly consist of non-crosslinked hyaluronic acid and six amino acids—substances naturally found in the body. Therefore, the risk of allergic reactions is considered very low.

However, it is not zero. If you have had an allergic reaction to hyaluronic acid or amino acids in the past, please consult with your doctor beforehand.

Infection:

The injection site will be disinfected and handled under sterile conditions, but there is a small risk of infection.

To help prevent infection, please keep the injection area clean after the procedure.

- You may experience some degree of pain during the procedure. If the pain becomes too intense, please inform your doctor—do not try to endure it.
- In rare cases, bruising may occur. Typically, it will gradually fade within 1 to 3 weeks but depending on the amount and location of the bleeding, it may take over a month to fully resolve in very rare cases.
- Post-inflammatory hyperpigmentation may occur. This usually improves gradually over several months, but in rare cases, it may persist.
- You can wear makeup from the day after the procedure. However, please avoid using harsh skincare products or exfoliants for about a week. Also, be sure to use sunscreen.
- For a few days after treatment, you may experience increased redness, swelling, or inflammation. Avoid strenuous exercise, saunas, and alcohol during this time.
- If you experience any unusual symptoms or complications following the procedure, appropriate treatment will be provided.
- To help prevent infection from accidental needle stick injuries, we may ask for your cooperation in providing a blood sample if necessary.

✿ Patients Who Cannot Receive Treatment or Require Special Precaution

- Individuals with skin diseases, skin inflammation, or infections (such as HIV, hepatitis B, hepatitis C), or those with extremely sensitive skin
- Those who have had an allergic reaction to Sunekos in the past
- Pregnant or breastfeeding individuals
- Individuals taking blood-thinning medications
- Individuals who have undergone procedures involving silicone implants

Please be sure to follow all instructions provided by your treating physician throughout the treatment period. Not following these instructions may reduce the effectiveness of the treatment and increase the risk of complications.

If you experience any unusual symptoms during the treatment process, please promptly report them to a doctor or nurse, and follow the physician's guidance after a proper medical assessment.

At our clinic, we take clinical photographs to document treatment progress and include them in your medical records. If you do not consent to these photographs, it may not be possible to adequately monitor your progress, and we may not be able to appropriately address inquiries about treatment results or manage complications (e.g., skin reactions or nerve symptoms) that may occur.

Please be aware that additional treatment fees may apply in the event of complications.
